9 February 2024

Beginning with Monday's assembly, the theme was the forthcoming General Election. We started by practicing voting on a later start to the day, a 4-day week, longer holidays, and Hector as Principal of Priory School, with the pupils voting in favour on all four topics. Looks like I am out of a job then!

We then got more serious and discussed the difference between democracy, autocracy and the reality of decision making, using Priory School as the example. Things became more factual, and I shared with the pupils the latest dates for the dissolution of Parliament and the Election, and the meaning and number of constituencies in the UK, exemplifying the latter by looking at the election outcome maps for 2010 and 2015. We talked about the 25 day 'Purdah', and the King's role in asking the leader of the winning party to form a new Government, and the role of the opposition party.

We finished on arguably the most important point of the assembly – voter apathy and the importance of exercising one's democratic right, whether at school council level or in the General Election, particularly given that members of our Upper Sixth can vote on the next Government.

The word and question of the week are:

- Word: Apathy (voter)
- Question: Why is it important to take an active part in democratic decision making?



Turning to Tuesday, we were fortunate to have a Tuesday Talk given by Professor Wills, Head of Mechanical Engineering at Southampton University.

Prof. Wills gave a fascinating talk on undergraduate life, studying at Southampton University and mechanical engineering. After leaving school, he studied Chemistry at university and this developed into Mechanical Engineering, both in industry and in academia, and Prof. Wills is not only a lecturer, but is also a researcher, consultant, and Head of Department (for a very large department).

Particularly interesting was his research into energy storage and batteries, and he explained this using many transport related examples, including electric cars. Pupils asked lots of questions about his research and involvement in university, national and international energy projects. Environmental concerns featured significantly in his talk and he explained current research into more environmentally friendly materials used to store energy. We are very grateful to Dr Wills for giving up his time to come to school and participate in our Tuesday Talk programme.



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As I stated last week, and in support of World Book Day on 7 March, I am posting on Facebook a different colleague's favourite book each day.
