
At St Mildred's Church last Friday, the school community remembered all those who made the ultimate sacrifice during the First World War and in all conflicts since.


The pupils conducted themselves in exemplary fashion, singing remembrance hymns, and reading and hearing about Fr Maximillian Kolbe, who voluntarily sacrificed his own life to save that of another whilst imprisoned in Auschwitz.

In preparation for the service, each class in the school had studied conflict in a particular country, and during service they shared brief details with the congregation whilst pinning a poppy on a map of the world to mark that country's location. This included the ongoing troubles in the Gaza Strip.




