One of the midwives is currently pregnant and she allowed herself to be scanned so that we could all hear the baby's heartbeat. This was unexpected and a real treat for the pupils and staff.

He was then asked to sit and stand and put on his shoes and tie his laces whilst wearing the vest. At the end of the talk, many more pupils tried the vest, as well as exploring the other visual aids brought along for our benefit. The team also talked about careers in midwifery, entry qualifications, and how it is not a career just for women.

We are so grateful to Mrs Styles and her colleagues, and we hope to get them back in the future to focus specifically on careers in this area of medicine.

The boys and girls listened attentively and answered my questions with maturity and sensitivity. I was very proud of them all. The Word of the Week is 'Peace', and the Question of the Week is 'How can arguments between nations be resolved without fighting, and do we have a role in this?'

Lastly, I felt it was important to state that this is not a Jews versus Muslims war; it is a war between Israel and Hamas, and we all hope that it ends peacefully very soon. Furthermore, British Jews and Muslims should not feel that they must take sides or fall out over this conflict, even if they disagree on politics.

The Eco-Council will now turn their attention to maintaining momentum after the highly successful 'Save the Seas Week', and if any parents work in environmental occupations and would like to meet with the team, then please do get in touch. Early conversations amongst the councillors regarding a possible future focus have been on the topic of how much we waste during the Christmas period.
